
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

- **Rappel tower 100m to the northwest**
- **Covered bleachers 85m to the north**

- **Numerous ruts approximately 1' deep in the western portion of the zone**
- **Power lines 330m to the west**
- **Ridgeline 520m to the south**

Support Equipment: This zone is capable of handling support equipment.

Overall Description of zone: LZ 62 is a vast zone that serves well for proficiency training and troop lift. Multiple aircraft can fit in this zone. There is additional room to land outside of the zone to the west, adding to the number of aircraft that may utilize this area.

Environmental Issues: LZ 62 is located in Arroyo Toad habitat. California Gnatcatcher habitat exists along the southern edge of the LZ. It is also located about 100m from riparian habitat and a designated rare plant area.
