### General Instructions

1. **A safety Brief will be conducted by the RSO prior to each event to all participants.**
2. **All personnel shall wear required PPE during all training events.**
3. **OIC & RSO Requirements -**
  - a. **40mm HEDP/25mm/Rockets**
    - i. **OIC Requirement – GySgt or Above**
    - ii. **RSO Requirement - SSgt or Above**
  - b. **.50 Caliber & Below/40mm TP**
    - i. **OIC Requirement – SSgt & Above**
    - ii. **RSO Requirement - Sgt or Above**
4. IOT **occupy** this range unit must have the following personnel/equipment:
  - a. RSO
  - b. Corpsman & Safety Vehicle
  - c. Positive Communication with LONGRIFLE
  - d. **An ORM reviewed and signed by the Command, RSO and (OIC - If using munitions).**
5. IOT go into a **hot status** on range unit must have the following personnel/equipment:
  - a. OIC
  - b. RSO
  - c. **LSSO (Sgt) – If using Laser**
  - d. Corpsman & Safety Vehicle
  - e. Positive Communication with LONGRIFLE
6. **POVs are authorized to park in parking lot area without a POV pass.**
7. The RSO & OIC will personally observe each event.
8. **A non-participating Corpsman will be stationed with safety vehicle.**
9. **At no time will any unit go from live fire to blank or SESAMS force-on-force within a 24 hour period**
10. **When Range guards are not in sight of the RSO they are required to be posted in pairs with positive communication with the RSO.**
11. Ammunition will only be issued per event and accounted for on NAVMC 11381.
12. After each event, unit leaders will conduct a line out.
13. Each RSO/PSO will certify to the OIC that all weapons are in Condition 4 prior to exiting the range/facility and all ammunition is accounted for.

## RANGE AND TRAINING REGULATIONS

### SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS

1. Range Guards will be posted at **52703 96950**
2. When Firing Mk19 HEDP -
  - a. **OIC/RSO will ensure that no personnel are located on R204B, MP-5 or MP-6.**
3. When Firing 25mm HEI-T -
  - a. **OIC/RSO will ensure that no personnel are located on R204B.**
  - b. **LONGRIFLE will ensure that no personnel are located on R210F 40mm Range or R208C.**
  - c. **Range Safety will ensure that the first gate (southern gate) to Jardine Canyon is closed and locked.**
4. During Armored Vehicles Live Fire, the following flag display system will be used:
  - a. **Red** – Weapons are loaded, on target, weapon arm switch is on fire, and manual safety is off.
  - b. **Green** – All weapons are cleared and elevated, weapon arm switch is on safe and manual safety is off. No ammunition on vehicle.
  - c. **Yellow & Red** – Malfunction or misfire, weapon arm switch is on safe and manual safety is on or ammunition on vehicle.
  - d. **Yellow & Green** – Malfunction, weapons are clear, weapon arm switch is on safe and manual safety is on, no ammunition on vehicle.
  - a. **Red & Green** – Crew preparing to fire or crew is conducting non-firing exercise, ammunition may be loaded to the feeder but the feeder may not be loaded, bolt is in the sear position and weapon arm switch is on safe and manual safety is on. Ammunition may be to the Coax machinegun but in the coax, bolt to the rear and manual safety is on. Ammunition is either stowed or loaded in ready boxes.
