Scheduling

1. Unit will utilize RFMSS to schedule range.
2. All scheduling of R-112A shall be coordinated through the Supervisor of Security Operations at the San Onofre Nuclear Generating Station (SONGS) at (949) 368-2839 or (949) 368-2207.
1. Final scheduling of this facility must be approved by MCB Camp Pendleton Range Scheduling.

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

1. **A safety brief will be conducted prior to each live fire event to all participants.**
2. **All personnel shall wear required PPE during all training events.**
3. **OIC & RSO Requirements -**
 - a. **Small Arms**
 - i. **OIC Requirement – SSgt or Above**
 - ii. **RSO Requirement - Sgt or Above**
 - b. **No Munitions**
 - i. **OIC Requirement – None**
 - ii. **RSO Requirement - Cpl or Above**
 - iii. **LASER (If Used) LSSO Requirement - Sgt or Above**
 - c. **EOD Operations**
 - i. **OIC Requirement – Sgt or Above (Qualified EOD Tech)**
 - ii. **RSO Requirement - Sgt or Above (Qualified EOD Tech)**
4. IOT **occupy** this range unit must have the following personnel/equipment:
 - a. RSO
 - b. Corpsman & Safety Vehicle
 - c. Positive Communication with LONGRIFLE
 - d. **An ORM reviewed and signed by the Command, RSO and OIC.**
5. IOT go into a **hot status** on range unit must have the following personnel/equipment:
 - a. OIC
 - b. RSO
 - c. **LSSO – If using Laser**
 - d. Corpsman & Safety Vehicle
 - e. Positive Communication with LONGRIFLE
6. The RSO & OIC will personally observe each event.
7. **A non-participating Corpsman will be stationed with safety vehicle.**
8. Ammunition will only be issued per event and accounted for on NAVMC 11381.
9. After each event, unit leaders will conduct a line out.
10. Each RSO/PSO will certify to the OIC that all weapons are in Condition 4 prior to exiting the range/facility and all ammunition is accounted for.

All weapon malfunctions shall be corrected per the appropriate TM/FM, and unit SOP.

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SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS

1. An air sentry will be posted by the RSO. Any time an aircraft is observed below 1000 AGL within the SDZ, a cease-fire will be called by the RSO.
- 2. At no time will personnel occupy the area of the berm between Ranges 111 and 112A.**
3. Target carriages shall be placed with the angle iron facing towards the shooter.
- 4. The use of steel targets shall comply with SOUM 1-02.**
5. Firing shall not continue until cleared by LONGRIFLE.
6. Vehicle parking is authorized to the rear of the range building located behind the 100-yard line only.
 - a. A **maximum of seven vehicles** can be parked on this range.
 - b. All personally owned vehicles require a pass issued by the Range Control Officer.
 - c. All other vehicles shall be parked at the 43 area football field.

For all EMP training;

- a. RSO will ensure that the top of the head of all targets are no higher than 5 feet;
- b. All EMP targets must be of softwood uprights, cardboard backing paper or cardboard targets.
- c. Any metal bases used must be soft metal.
- d. No burst or automatic fires allowed

Static Firing Range Instructions

- a. All fires shall be conducted from the designated firing lines, on their associated firing points, to their assigned targets only.
- b. No personnel shall be forward of any firing line in a hot status.
- c. 7.62 rifles are authorized at the 100-yard line only.**

Transition Course Instructions

- a.** Firing points may be established anywhere between the 15 and 100-yard lines when firing within the established lateral limits of the range. **(7.62 authorized at the 100-yard line only.)**
- b. The OIC/RSO shall ensure the angle of fire to the targets does not impact yard line markers when firing positions are established, and does not impact the rebar target carriages at an angle other than from its direct front.
- c. All rebar target carriages not supporting the training scenario shall be removed and staged behind the 100-yard line until training is completed.
- d. Only one shooter at a time shall fire the transition course.
- e. No personnel shall be forward of the shooter's position while in a hot status.
- f. All moving target systems shall be emplaced forward of the 7-yard line and within the left and right lateral limits of the range.
- g. A minimum standoff distance of 15 yards shall be maintained while engaging the moving target system.
- h. Dry runs shall be conducted prior to live-fire to ensure shooters have clearly identified the targets that may be engaged from each firing point to ensure engagements remain within the lateral limits of the range.

Weapons shall be on safe when transitioning from one position to the next.
