RANGE AND TRAINING REGULATIONS

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

1. **A safety Brief will be conducted prior to each live fire event to all participants.**
2. IOT **occupy** this range unit must have the following personnel/equipment:
 - RSO
 - Corpsman & Safety Vehicle
 - Positive Communication with LONGRIFLE
 - **An ORM reviewed and signed by the Command, RSO and OIC.**
 - If ammunition is present on range - Ammo Guards will be armed
3. IOT **go into a hot status** on range unit must have the following personnel/equipment:
 - OIC
 - RSO
 - **NAVMC 11381 filled out by the OIC**
 - Corpsman & Safety Vehicle
 - Positive Communication with LONGRIFLE
4. **RSO will verify the left and right lateral limits utilizing a compass and map.**
 - Overall range lateral limits will be identified.
 - Each firing position lateral limits will be identified.
5. The RSO & OIC will personally observe each live fire event.
6. **A non-participating Corpsman will be stationed with safety vehicle.**
7. **A full rehearsal will be conducted prior to live fire with all safety and training personnel.**
8. **Unit is required mark/post signs for any lateral limits and/or MSLs listed in this brief if not already marked/posted.**
9. **Minimum engagement distances for RETS or PITS targets is as follows:**
 - 25 meters – 5.56mm
 - 100 meters – 7.62mm
 - Use of .50 cal and above is **not authorized** on PITS targets.
 - Use of .50 cal and below (Ball or 4/1 Only) on RETS ranges **is authorized.**
 - Use of .50 cal **RAFUS (A606)** on RETS ranges is **only authorized** on vehicle targets.
 - At no time will any individual climb on top and shoot down into any target berm/box.
 - **At no time will RETS or PITS targets be exposed for more than 30 seconds.**
10. **At no time will any unit go from live fire to blank or SESAMS force-on-force within a 24 hour period**
11. **When Range guards are not in sight of the RSO they are required to be posted in pairs with positive communication with the RSO.**
12. Ammunition will only be issued per event and accounted for on NAVMC 11381.
13. After each event, unit leaders will conduct a line out.
14. Each RSO/PSO will certify to the OIC that all weapons are in Condition 4 prior to exiting the range and all ammunition is accounted for.
15. Helmets and flak jackets shall be worn for the following live fire training events:
 - Live fire and movement/maneuver
 - High explosives or grenades
 - Machineguns
 - Close Quarters Battle in shoot houses
16. Ensure all weapons are cleared and inspected prior to departing the firing line.
17. All weapon malfunctions shall be corrected per the appropriate TM/FM, and unit SOP.
18. Weapons cleaning gear is hazardous waste, and shall not be placed in the trash. The items should be collected and returned to their HazMat representative, or to their local Armory for proper disposal.

SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS

1. Cross-lane firing is prohibited.
2. Rubber ball hand grenades shall be employed by hand only.
3. 7.62mm is for BZO only – **No EMP.**
4. Helicopters may over fly the area at 1,000 ft. AGL and above. When firing 7.62mm an air sentry shall be designated to observe for aircraft entering into the range surface danger zone. In the event an aircraft enters the range surface danger zone, an immediate cease-fire shall be conducted and LONGRIFLE notified. Firing shall not continue until cleared by LONGRIFLE.
5. For all **EMP** training:
 - a. RSO will insure that the top of the head of all targets are no higher than 5 feet.
 - b. All EMP targets must be of softwood uprights, cardboard backing paper or cardboard targets.
 - c. Any metal bases used must be soft metal with sandbags placed on them.
 - d. Pallets will not be used for any other training except BZO only.
6. All **M249/M240G BZO** and 10 meter qualification will be conducted using pallets set on the field firing line.
7. For all **BZO** training:
 - a. Any engineer stakes used for pallets must be placed on the outside edges of the pallets.
 - b. Firing line will be backed off the target line 10 meters.
