GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS


1. **A safety Brief will conducted prior to each live fire event to all participants.**
2. IOT occupy this range unit must have the following personnel/equipment:
 - a. RSO
 - b. Corpsman & Safety Vehicle
 - c. Positive Communication with LONGRIFLE
 - d. If ammunition is present on range - Ammo Guards will be armed.
3. IOT go into a hot status on range unit must have the following personnel/equipment:
 - a. OIC
 - b. RSO
 - c. Corpsman & Safety Vehicle
 - d. Positive Communication with LONGRIFLE
4. The RSO & OIC will personally observe each live fire event.
5. **A signed ORM approved by the RCO must be on hand IOT conduct training.**
6. **A non-participating Corpsman will be stationed with safety vehicle.**
7. **A full rehearsal will be conducted prior to live fire.**
8. **At no time will any unit go from live fire to blank or SESAMS force-on-force within a 24 hour period**
9. **At any time Range guards are required, they will be posted in pairs with positive communication with the RSO.**
10. Ammunition will only be issued per event and accounted for on NAVMC 11381.
11. After each event, unit leaders will conduct a line out.
12. Each RSO will certify to the OIC that all weapons are in Condition 4 prior to exiting the range and all ammunition is accounted for.
13. Ensure all weapons are cleared and inspected prior to departing the firing line.
14. All weapon malfunctions shall be corrected per the appropriate TM/FM, and unit SOP.
15. Weapons cleaning gear is hazardous waste, and shall not be not placed in the trash. The items should be collected and returned to their HazMat representative, or to their local Armory for proper disposal. Unit/Area representatives are below.



SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS


1. Range manager and/or Assistant Range Manager will ensure that all aspects of this instruction are adhered to.
2. RSO must be an SSgt (E-6).
3. All personnel shall conduct a non live-fire rehearsal prior to conducting live-fire scenarios.
4. The RSO will accompany personnel as they execute both the rehearsal and the live -fire scenario.
5. All training will be conducted IAW MCO 3570.1b, BO P35500.1N, SOUM 2-02 & this instruction.
6. Range consists of the following:
 - a. Bill Rogers: Stationary firing line with automated targets.
 - i. **Can be shot concurrently with Stationary Plate.**
 1. No movement down range while Stationary Plate is in Hot Status or any other lane on Bill Rogers is in a Hot Status.
 - ii. **Can not be shot concurrently with any down range movement on Man Verses Man or Rifle Course.**
 - b. Stationary Plate Rack Course: Stationary firing line with manual targets.
 - i. **Can be shot concurrently with Bill Rogers.**
 1. No movement down range while Bill Rogers is in Hot Status.
 - ii. **Can not be shot concurrently with any down range movement Man Verses Man or Rifle Course.**
 - c. Man verses Man Course: Designated maneuver course with manual targets. Steel targets are configured and placed to test a shooter's ability to engage parallel and oblique while the shooter is moving in a forward direction.
 - i. **Can be shot concurrently when using static fire on man vs. man.**
 - ii. **Can not be shot concurrently with Bill Rogers, Stationary Plate, or Rifle Course when man vs. man is making movement down range.**
 - d. Rifle Course: Designated maneuver course with manual targets. Steel targets are configured and placed to test a shooter's ability to engage while the shooter from Shooting Position to Shooting Position.
 - i. **Can not be shot concurrently with Bill Rogers, Stationary Plate, or Man Verses Man.**
7. **General Safety**
 - a. **Safety Equipment**: -
 - i. Wrap around ballistic eye protection (glasses or goggles) and ear protection are mandatory for everyone on the steel bay regardless of what they are doing, no exceptions.
 - ii. All personnel will have long sleeves and long trousers.
 - b. No personnel shall be placed inside the 20° Dispersion Area of another target.
 - c. No more than two shooters will be on the Maneuver course at any one time. They must travel on opposite sides at all times.
 - d. At no time will a shooter engage targets to his rear or in the direction of the start point.
 - e. Safe manipulation of the weapon will be monitored closely at all times.
 - f. A range manager and unit RSO will conduct a walk through prior to firing to ensure safe placement of all targets.
 - g. Shooters will stay behind the designated firing line or within the designated course walkway while conducting all live fire operations.
8. **Pistol**
9. **Rifle**
 - a. 5.56 frangible ammunition is the only authorized rifle ammunition.
 - b. Engagements shall not be closer than 25 yards.
10. **Targets**
 - a. All targets shall be commercially manufactured and be certified Brennel hardness of 400 to 550.
 - b. Certificate of hardness must be maintained and available for inspection at the range.
 - c. Homemade or unit constructed targets are not authorized.
 - d. Targets that a warped, dented or cracked shall not be used.
 - e. Gimmick type targets such as rotating Christmas Tress, or targets that flip back & forth are not authorized.
 - f. Soft sandy-type soil (Sand Box) shall be placed in front of the target to prevent ricocheting off the ground.
 - g. No target shall be placed inside the 20° Dispersion Area of another target.
