Hey E-Bike Riders!

This month, let's talk safety. We all love the convenience and fun of zipping around on our electric rides, but it's crucial to prioritize safety for ourselves and those around us.

***Under 12 years not authorized to ride any class E-bike**

- **Understand Your E-Bike's Class:** Be aware of your e-bike's class (Class 1, 2, or 3) and the speed limits. Obey all local laws and regulations regarding e-bike use.
- **Read the Manual:** Familiarize yourself with your e-bike's features, operation, and maintenance requirements.
- **Helmets are a MUST:** Seriously, no exceptions. A good helmet can be the difference between a minor scrape and a serious injury. Make sure yours fits properly!
- **Be Seen:** Especially as the days get shorter (or longer, depending on the season!), visibility is key. Wear bright clothing, use reflective tape, and ensure your lights are working properly. Consider adding extra lights to your bike/scooter!
- **Know the Rules of the Road:** Just like cars, e-bikes and scooters are subject to traffic laws. Familiarize yourself with local regulations regarding where you can ride, speed limits, and any other specific rules.
- **Signal your Intentions:** Use hand signals to indicate turns and stops.

- **Braking Basics:** Practice your braking technique in a safe area. Get comfortable with how your brakes respond in different conditions (wet, dry, etc.). Sudden stops can be dangerous, so learn to anticipate and brake smoothly.
- **Be Aware of Your Surroundings:** Pay attention to pedestrians, cars, and other cyclists. Avoid distractions like headphones or texting while riding.
- **Maintain a Safe Speed:** Adjust your speed to the conditions. Slow down in crowded areas, on uneven surfaces, and when visibility is poor.

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Thanksgiving Safety Tips

Here's how to keep your Thanksgiving celebration safe and enjoyable:

Stay Alert & Focused: Avoid distractions like phone calls or excessive socializing while you're at the stove/oven. Never leave cooking unattended!

Timer: Set it to remind yourself the stove or oven is on. A simple reminder can prevent burnt food and potential fires.

Turkey Fryer: If you're frying a turkey, do it OUTDOORS, away from buildings and wooden structures. Never leave the fryer unattended. Use extreme caution when lowering and raising the turkey. Make sure the turkey is completely thawed before frying. Never use a turkey fryer indoors or in a garage.

Fire Extinguisher: Have a fire extinguisher handy. Know how to use it! A Class B fire extinguisher is best for kitchen fires. Keep it accessible and in good working order.

Food temperature: Use a food thermometer to ensure your foods reach the safe internal temperature. The thickest part of the thigh of a turkey should reach 165°F (74°C).

Children Safety: Supervise children closely, especially in cooking areas.

Pet Safety: Keep pets away from the kitchen and scraps. Many Thanksgiving foods are toxic to animals.

Smoke Detectors: Ensure your smoke detectors are working properly and have fresh batteries. Test them before Thanksgiving Day.

Travel Safely: If you're traveling, make sure your vehicle is in good condition and you plan your route in advance with alternatives.
