WHY YOU ARE BEING NOTIFIED: The Installation Restoration (IR) Program at Marine Corps Base Camp Pendleton (MCBCP), California announces establishment of an online information repository and the completion of its Fifth Five-Year Review of environmental cleanup actions in accordance with the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act (CERCLA). CERCLA was established to protect human health and the environment for sites that had been contaminated by disposal of chemicals. The IR Program is a Department of Defense (DoD) program for cleaning up soil and groundwater contamination resulting from past years of operation at military bases.

MCB Camp Pendleton's IR Program is responsible for approximately 80 IR Sites throughout the base that were found to contain a variety of contaminants including pesticide, metals, petroleum, and solvents related to vehicle/aircraft maintenance, and other activities. Many of the IR Sites have been closed with no further action either because they were cleaned up or because investigations demonstrated there was no contamination at the site that presented a risk to human health or the environment. Remediation activities, including groundwater monitoring, started in April 1997 and continues through the present.
