1. Situation. Pursuant to the authority contained in references (a) and (b), and based upon input from the Armed Forces Disciplinary Control Board (AFDCB) meeting held on 11 May 2020, this Bulletin is published. Distribution of this information should be disseminated through all available means, to include: command briefings, command bulletin boards, and personnel check-in process.

2. Cancellation. MCIWEST-MCB CAMPENBul 1620 of 17 May 19. The AFDCB has received no requests from off-limits establishments to consider for removal from the off-limits designation contained herein.

3. Mission. To prescribe policies and procedures for the establishment and operation of Marine Corps Installations-West Marine Corps Base, Camp Pendleton (MCIWEST-MCB CAMPEN) off-limits establishments and locations.

4. Execution

a. Commander's Intent. To announce off-limits establishments and areas of caution in and around MCIWEST-MCB CAMPEN.

b. Concept of Operations. Reference (a) requires military installation commanders to coordinate off-installation operations with other service commanders, as applicable, for uniformity of effort and economy of resources. Accordingly, this Bulletin incorporates off-limit establishments and areas from other installation commanders in the region.

5. Administration and Logistics. This Bulletin constitutes a lawful general order and is punitive in nature. Violations of this Bulletin by United States Service Members are subject to punishment under Article 92 of the Uniform Code of Military Justice (UCMJ).

a. The following establishments and areas are off-limits to Service Members at all times:

(2) While several States have legalized marijuana; the use, possession, or distribution of marijuana and its cannabinoids remain prohibited under Federal Law and thus constitute a violation of the UCMJ. Service Members are therefore prohibited from entering any business, medicinal, recreational, or otherwise, that sells or distributes marijuana or tetrahydrocannabinol (THC) in any form. This prohibition applies to fixed locations, as well as mobile dispensaries. Service Members are also prohibited from attending, volunteering at, working, or otherwise participating in marijuana festivals and conferences, or any widely attended commercial event that sells, promotes, celebrates, encourages, or seeks to further the use of marijuana and THC-based products. Prohibited events include, but are not limited to: Emerald Cup, the Cannabinoids Cup, Humboldt Green Week, Cannagrow, Hemp Fest, and Cannifest.

(3) The following areas are not off-limits, but are potentially dangerous and caution should be exercised when in the vicinity:

Naval Base San Diego Perimeter Area	Some areas surrounding the external perimeter area of Naval Base San Diego are potentially dangerous. Particular

	precautions should be exercised during hours of darkness on Main Street from 32nd Street to the I-5 in National City
Trolley Stations	Many trolley stations become potentially dangerous areas after trolley services secure, especially at Palomar Street and San Ysidro. Personnel using trolley services should know the hours of operation. Personnel utilizing trolley services may be at a higher risk for crimes of violence and may also be targeted by criminal elements recruiting individuals to engage in dangerous cross-border schemes.

f. Areas of Concern and Information Concerning the Safety and Welfare of Service Members

(1) Synthetic Stimulants and Opioids

(a) Pursuant to California H&S code 11357.5 and 11375.5, as of 1 January 2012, it is illegal to sell synthetic cannabinoids and/or synthetic stimulants (e.g., bath salts, spice, etc.). Service Members are reminded that even if sold in local establishments, the wrongful use, possession, manufacture, or distribution of controlled substance analogues, natural substances, chemicals, propellants, prescribed and/or over-the-counter drugs, or pharmaceutical compounds with the intent to

induce intoxication, excitement, or stupefaction of the central nervous system, such as those found in spice and bath salts, are a violation of Article 92, UCMJ and may result in administrative or disciplinary action.

(b) Fentanyl and carfentanil represent a significant health hazard to Service Members, particularly if encountered unwittingly while conducting routine command functions, such as field day and health and comfort inspections. Fentanyl and carfentanil are highly potent synthetic opioids. Fentanyl is listed as a schedule II prescription drug that mimics the effects of morphine in the human body but has potency 50 to 100 times that of morphine, while carfentanil is 10,000 times more potent than morphine. Ingestion can occur orally, inhaled through the nose or mouth, or absorbed through the skin or eyes. Fentanyl can be lethal at very low exposure levels with doses as small as two micrograms. Fentanyl and carfentanil may come in several forms, including powder, blotter paper, tablets, patch, liquid, and spray. Signs and symptoms of fentanyl exposure or overdose usually occur within minutes and may include cardiac arrest, respiratory depression or arrest, drowsiness, disorientation, sedation, or unresponsiveness, pinpoint pupils, clammy skin, bluish or purplish lips or fingernails, and vomiting or gurgling. Due to recent seizures, trends, and uses of fentanyl and carfentanil with other illegal substances, identified by Drug Enforcement Agency, the potential exists for Service Members to come into contact with these dangerous substances. In order to protect Service Members, the following precautions should be applied:

1. Use of nitrile gloves with a minimum thickness of five millimeters should be worn during all types of inspections where there is a potential for Command Members to come into contact with these substances; latex gloves have been determined to be ineffective at preventing exposure to fentanyl.

2. If Service Members discover an unknown white powdery substance or other unidentified substance, do not touch or attempt to identify it. Secure the location and notify the nearest security personnel.

3. If a Service Member believes they have been exposed to or display any of the above mentioned symptoms, call 911 immediately. Naloxone can counteract a fentanyl overdose.

(2) On 8 November 2016, California approved Proposition 64, which is also known as the Adult Use of Marijuana Act (AUMA). Among other items, the Act legalized possession and use of up to one ounce of marijuana and personal use cultivation up to six plants per residence by adults 21 and over. However, the Act does not apply on federal property and Article 112a, UCMJ prohibits the wrongful use or possession of marijuana. Commands should remain informed on the impact of AUMA in their communities and aware of the potential risks for Service Members.


