



COMMANDING GENERAL'S SAFETY POLICY STATEMENT



Marine Corps Installations West-Marine Corps Base, Camp Pendleton Bases and Stations are the host and deployment platforms for supporting I Marine Expeditionary Force and the training activities of the U.S. Marine Corps. We must lead the Supporting Establishment for our Corps by facilitating for mission success of our partners in the Fleet Marine Force. To meet that purpose we must support the continued safety of our Marines, Sailors, Civilian Marines, and family members.

The Department of Defense and the Marine Corps must continuously evolve and change to meet national training requirements. We must take ownership of our mission to be a catalyst for change and efficiency in supporting our Marine Corps and preserving the force. By modifying how we view safety, Risk Management (RM), and force preservation we can improve. We will use the Marine Corps Safety Management System (MCSMS) to achieve operational excellence.

The cornerstone of our safety strategy are to employ the four pillars of our Safety Management System, which are Policy and Leadership, Risk Management, Safety Assurance, and Safety Promotion and Training. Day to day adherence and enforcement of professional standards and prescribed procedures, are the responsibility of all aboard Marine Corps Installations West-Marine Corps Base, Camp Pendleton Base and Stations. If you see an unsafe situation developing, it is your responsibility to halt the process and identify the hazard to all concerned.

Safety is a daily requirement. We owe it to the Marine Corps and each other to win this fight each day, and pass this legacy on to our successors. Safety and RM must be an integral part of on and off duty routines. By knowing and following rules, checking our assumptions, building margins of safety and war-gaming our plans, we will succeed.

Safety is grounded in leadership, responsibility, standing operating procedures, discipline, and training. By working together we can achieve our goal of improved readiness by our actions.
