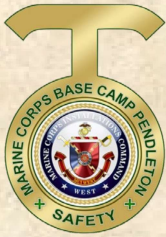
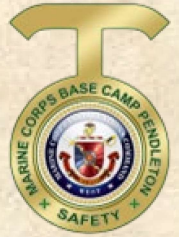


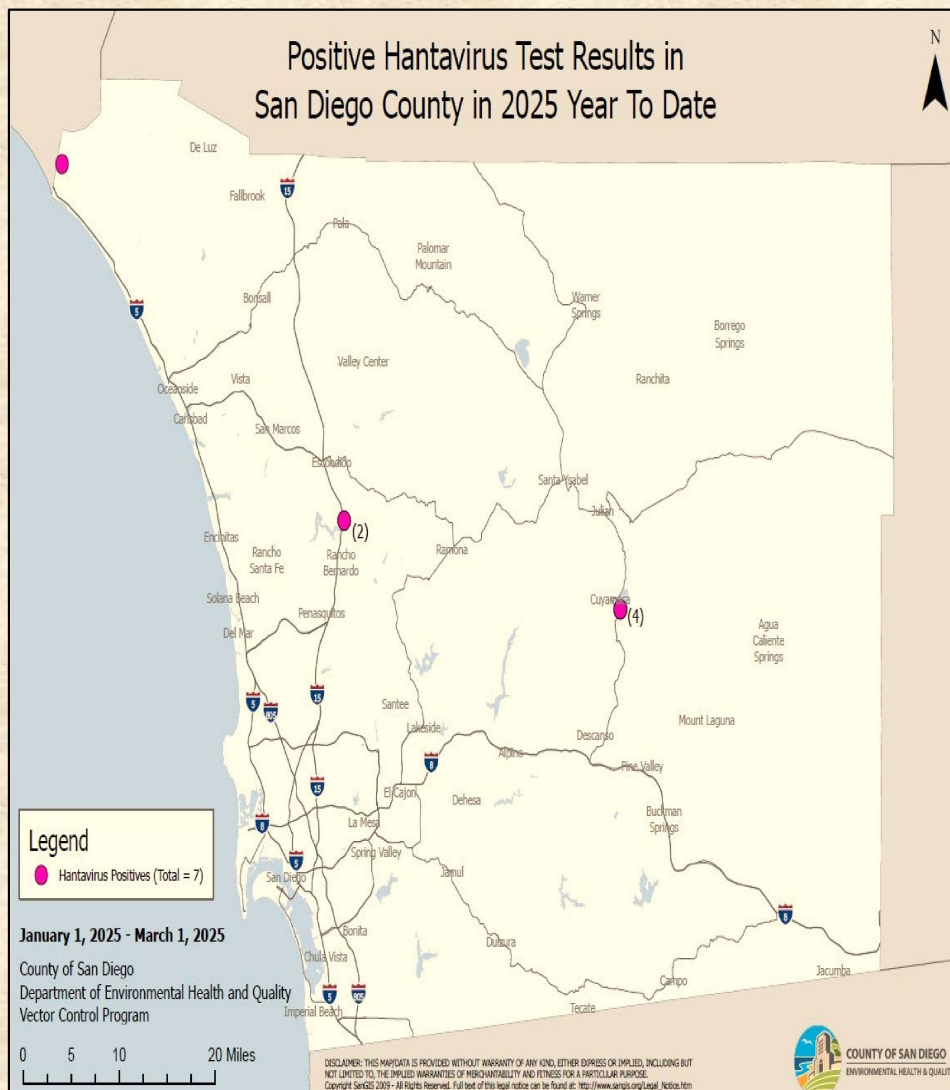

**WHAT IS HANTA VIRUS?**

Hantavirus is a rare but deadly virus that is spread by infected rodents. The infection is spread by inhaling particles from rodent droppings. The disease does not affect the mice themselves but can make people seriously ill. About 30-40% of people who develop respiratory symptoms may die from the disease.

There has been a total of (7) positive rodents discovered in San Diego county this year.

WHAT TO DO?

- ✓ Air out all unused structures before entering.
- ✓ If mouse or rat droppings are discovered, use a wet cleaning method with proper PPE. (N95 mask, gloves, eye protection)
- ✓ Contact the Pest Management Office with questions or concerns (760) 725-9757.

WET CLEANING METHOD.

Make a disinfectant solution (10 parts water to 1 part bleach).

Spray the disinfectant solution on dead rodents or droppings and let sit for 15-20 minutes before cleaning.

Soak sponges in disinfectant solution and clean.

Place dead rodents, droppings, nesting material, and all cleaning supplies in a sealed plastic bag and throw bag away immediately. After cleaning, wash your gloved hands, remove the gloves and dispose of them, and then wash your bare hands as well.

DID YOU KNOW?

6. Hit “Book”.
