

NO TOUCH = NO TICKET

New statewide law as of July 1, 2025 **HANDS OFF YOUR PHONE**

WHAT'S PERMITTED

- Devices must be securely mounted on your dashboard, windshield, or center console.
- Only single tap or swipe allowed to start voice commands, calls, or navigate.
- Voice-activated / Bluetooth systems are fine.

WHO IT APPLIES TO

- All drivers statewide — including fleet, delivery, rideshare, and government vehicles.
- Passengers and emergency personnel on duty are exempt.

WHAT'S NOW ILLEGAL

- Holding or touching your phone at any time while driving — even at red lights or in traffic.
- Looking at GPS, messages, playlists, or any app manually.
- Scrolling, typing, or tapping — even one-handed — without a mounted device.

PENALTIES

- First offense (**off-base**) fine is \$20, totaling around \$136 after fees.
- Second offense (**off-base**) within 36 months: around \$272 + a driver's license point.
- First offense (**on-base**) 6 Points and Remedial driving.
